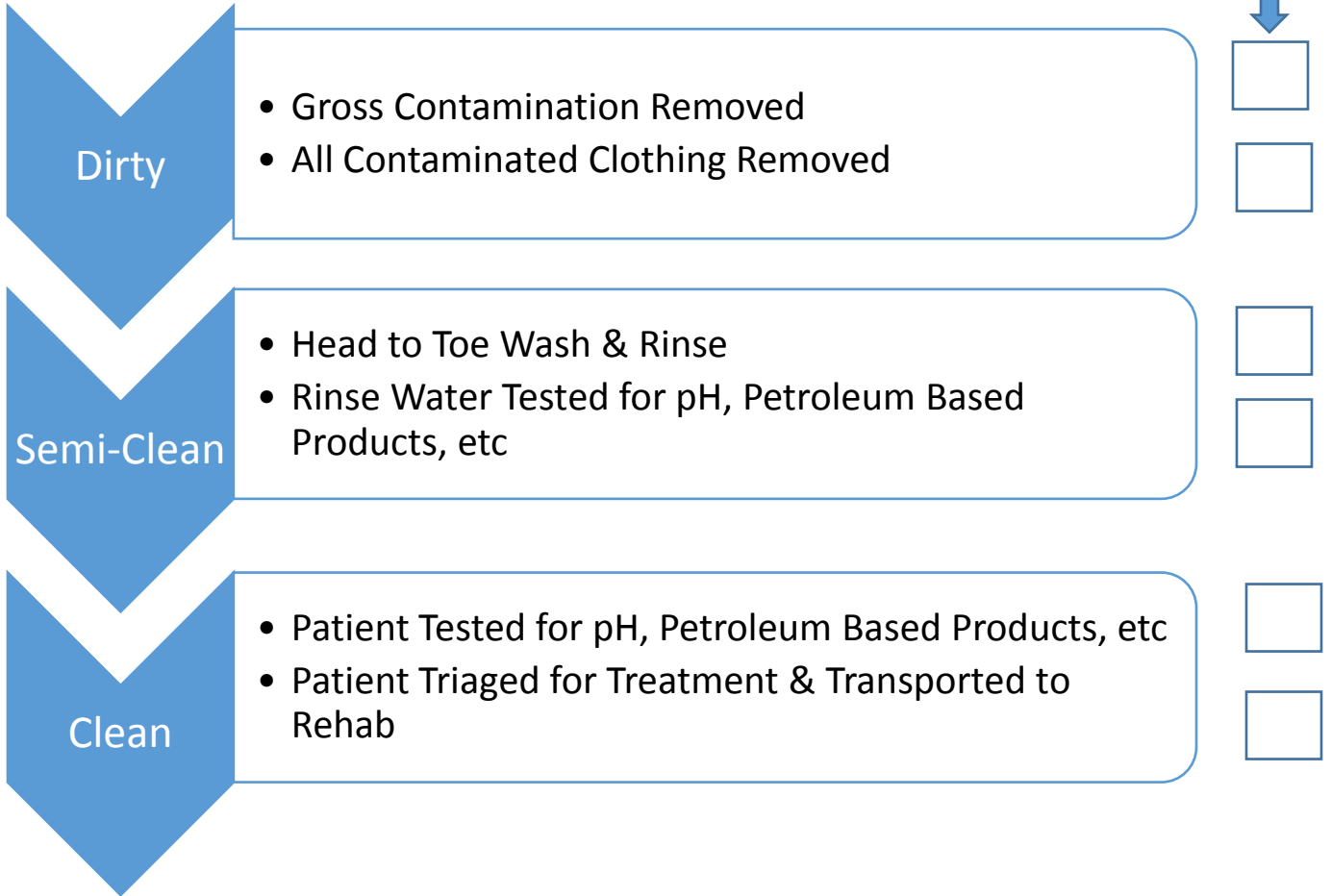
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## Forensic Science and Law Enforcement Student Check List

1. All students participating in the decon exercise will wear under their clothes either shorts, swim suits (no speedo or bikini swim suits), short sleeve tee shirts, and wear flip flops.
2. All students are to bring extra clothes to change into after the decon exercise, plastic bags will be provided for your wet clothes after the exercise.
3. Per PAVA no cell phones are allowed to be used during the exercise, the entire decon exercise will be videoed by PAVA representatives to document the drill.
4. All students will have water to stay hydrated throughout the exercise.
5. Rest rooms will be provided next to the decon pad area.
6. Remember, students you are all representing the SVCTE – Forensic Science and Law Enforcement program as volunteers for this functional exercise.

## Emergency Decontamination Participant Worksheet

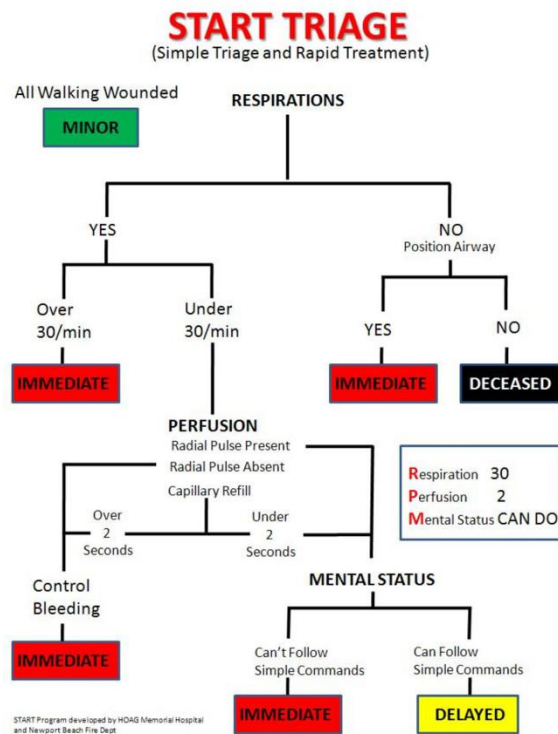
1. Within the triage stage, which were you: minor, immediate (breathing or not), delayed or deceased?

TIME	MAJOR EVENTS			
7:30 hrs.	Both Forensics and Law enforcement classes will take roll, make sure all students have their SVCTE ID badges. All students need to double check that they brought extra clothing, towel, flip flop that they can change into after the decontamination drill.			
8:00 hrs	Leave SVCTE on bus to Palo Alto Veteran Affairs Campus			
9:00 hrs.	Bus arrives at PAVA campus go to staging area at Miranda Drive at Building 50, for briefing and walk-through.			
9:15 hrs.	SVCTE Volunteers are to be briefed by Operations Chief; i. e. scenario description, patients medical signs and symptoms, and role playing instructions.			
9:30 hrs.	SVCTE Volunteers are to stage for role playing exercise.			
10:00 hrs.	Mass Casualty decon exercise begins; i.e. all SVCTE student patients crown decon entrance are triages per individual signs and symptoms.			
11:00 hrs.	Decon exercise continues until all patients have been triaged for their specific injuries; minor, immediate, delayed, or deceased.			
	Decon operations; i.e. all patients need to have been instructed to remove outer clothing to remove gross contamination from materials exposure, emergency decon of gross materials, secondary decon in showers, unless patient is non-ambulatory will be assisted by decon team members.			
12:00 hrs.	All patients are transported for treatment to emergency room via shuttle.			
12:30 hrs.	Decon operations is completed, and SVCTE student patients are transported back to decon pad to change their clothes and go to rehab station for lunch. Note: During the decon exercise PAVA-canteen food services delivered lunch (sandwiches, chips, cookies, coffee, and condiments), however, it was later determined that the lunch was only for decon team members, observers, and evaluators. Decon team member stated that per Kevin Storm's the canteen food delivered was for decon team members, etc, and that the SVCTE volunteers were getting pizza for lunch. Chief Storm's was advised as well as Jay Kim, PE Chief Safety/Emergency Management to the disappointment of not having the canteen food services for the SVCTE volunteers.			
13:00 hrs.	SVCTE volunteers were debriefed from PAVA - Safety Operations Chief and advised all of pending certificate of appreciation to be given to all participants once all names were verified and signed by the PAVA Director.			
	Pizza finally was delivered and all SVCTE volunteers ate lunch and reflected on the decon exercise experience.			
14:30 hrs.	SVCTE volunteers returned by bus to SVCTE school campus to complete decon exercise evaluation. Prepared by Oscar Bazaruto, SVCTE Volunteer Coordinator.
